

Nature Notes

Northern Saw-whet Owl

The incessant call of the male Northern Sawwhet Owl during breeding season sounds like a saw being sharpened or whetted. Some winters a number of this little owl are found well south of the normal breeding range. This species is one of the smallest owls. Note the lack of ear tufts, dark bill and white eyebrows. Juveniles have tawnycinnamon underparts, chocolate-brown upperparts with white spotting and a bold white Y from beak to eyebrows. Females are larger than males.

The Northern Saw-whet Owl sings during breeding season only. Its song is a repeated one note whistle of 'too-too-too" sometimes for hours at a time.

This owl lives solitary or in pairs. It eats small rodents, large insects, birds and bats, hunting primarily at night. It perches low, searching for prey, then flies down snatching it up with its talons.

Northern Saw-whet Owls are territorial birds and often respond to imitations of their call by speeding up the rate of their calling. They are often attracted to a playback of their call.

The nest is in a tree cavity, abandoned woodpecker hole or nesting box 4 - 18 metres above the ground. There are no nest materials. They use nest boxes about the size of Wood Duck boxes.

The Northern Saw-whet Owl has 1 brood per year. Incubation is 26 - 29 days by the female. The young stay in the nest 27-34 days and are fed by both sexes. The male brings the food, and then the female feeds the young for about the first 18 days.






