## Nature Notes

### Red-Headed Woodpecker

The ecological eastern counterpart of Lewis's Woodpecker, this is the only woodpecker in the East with an entirely red head. Unlike many other woodpeckers, the Red-Headed Woodpecker catches most of its food in flight, from the ground, or by gleaning it from tree trunks and limbs. It rarely bores holes in trees to probe for insects. The male does, however, vigorously drill its nest cavity with the aid of its mate.

In light the white underparts, white rump and large white secondary patches contrast sharply with the black tail, wings and back. Juveniles have brownish black upperparts and brown heads.

The Red-Headed Woodpecker lives in solitary or in pairs. It eats various insects, spiders, millipedes and centipedes. It will sometimes take eggs and the young of other birds, mice, corn, grains, various nuts and berries. Red-Headed Woodpeckers often hunt from low perches, flying to the ground to pick up prey or nuts. They cache acorns and nuts, removing shells and storing the meat for winter.

Incubation is 12 – 14 days by both the male and female. The young stay in the nest for 27 – 31 days. They are fed by both the male and female. There are typically 1-2 broods per year.

The Red-Headed Woodpecker is listed as a species of special concern. The population has declined in the past century due to habitat loss, collisions with automobiles and competition for nesting cavities with Starlings. Creosote-coated utility poles are lethal to the eggs and the young of the Red-Headed Woodpecker.

## Vintage Curling Sweaters at the Langruth Curling Bonspiel

A few vintage curling sweaters were worn at the Langruth Curling Bonspiel on February 25<sup>th</sup>. What fun to see these sweaters and imagine the curling history that they had been part of.

Vintage curling sweaters are a hand knitted, shawl-collared wool sweater, often referred to as Cowichan sweaters. The name comes from the Cowichan people of southeastern Vancouver, BC, who pioneered the distinctively patterned, heavy knit sweaters. They are also called Mary Maxim sweaters as the Mary Maxim Company sold a wide variety of knitting patterns for these sweaters. (<http://curlinghistory.blogspot.com>)

Jordan Jackson wore his grandfather's Langruth Curling sweater. Alan Jackson's curling buttons still decorated both sleeves. The Langruth, or Lakeview, Curling Club was formed in 1949. The original Langruth Curling Rink was located west of Main Street and was moved to the current Sports Grounds during the winter of 1967-68. Many enjoyed weekly curling nights and annual bonspiels until it's closing in the early 90s.

## Off To The Races: Salt Plains Raceway

On the south side of Hwy 16 just west of the junction of Hwy 50 and 16 is a large, overgrown oval measuring one-fifth mile end-to-end and about one-half mile around. Many will remember the race track known as the Salt Plains Stockcar Raceway. It operated from 1966 to about 1983 by an incorporated group called the Gladstone Stock Car Club, which had previously raced at the Gladstone Fairgrounds. The track ran weekly stock car races on Sunday afternoons.

In July 1968, a 23-year-old school teacher from Gladstone was killed at the track when his car went out of control and slammed into a safety barricade made of heavy wooden poles.

Today, the site is a livestock pasture. Some automobile and tractor tires, embedded part-way in the ground can still be seen.

## Celebrate St. Patrick's Day

St. Patrick's Day falls on Friday, March 17<sup>th</sup>. Although the holiday originally started as a Christian feast day celebrating the life of St. Patrick and the spread of Christianity to Ireland, today, it is a day of celebration of all things Irish. The significance of March 17<sup>th</sup> is that it's said to be the date of St. Patrick's death in the late 5<sup>th</sup> century (circa A.D. 493).



St. Patrick, born in Britain, was captured by slave traders when he was 16 and brought to Ireland to be a shepherd. After six years of imprisonment, he escaped back to Britain. While imprisoned he had become a Christian. He is said to have had visions from God, telling him to go back to Ireland and spread the gospel. He spent the next twenty years preaching and teaching in Ireland and created churches and monasteries throughout the country.

Shamrocks are associated with St. Patrick's Day because, legend says, St. Patrick used its three leaves to explain the Holy Trinity in his teachings (The Father, the Son and the Spirit). The truth of the legend, however, is in question, as there is no direct record that the saint actually used shamrocks as a teaching tool. Even so, it became customary to wear green clothes, accessories and shamrocks in celebrating St. Patrick's Day.

On March 17<sup>th</sup> wear green and celebrate all things Irish. Happy St. Patrick's Day!
