
Yellowhead Regional Water Co-op Rural Water Lines

The Municipality of WestLake-Gladstone has contracted Eagle Eye Excavation to complete the rural water line expansion for connection to the Yellowhead Regional Water Co-op. The Contractor will be installing the main water lines in municipal right of ways, Provincial Highways right of way and/or by easement on private properties. Work will be happening in different areas of the municipality through to approximately November 2023.

If you are currently farming a municipal right of way, including ditch areas and roadways, please note that there could be crop damage to the area that the contractor needs to access. The Municipality will **NOT** be reimbursing or compensating for any crop damage or loss on municipal right of ways due to the construction of the water line.

Nature Notes

Tree Swallow

From the Archive of Raymond O'Connor

The Tree Swallow is equally common in open fields, marshes, or towns. This bird's ability to adapt to its ever-changing environment has led to its abundant and widespread population.

Migrating in huge flocks during the day, it is one of the first swallows to its winter home in upper North America. Many winter on the southern Atlantic Coast, Gulf Coast and in Florida.

In flight it shows dark upperparts, white under parts, triangular wings with greenish under wing linings and a notched tail.

Gregarious in migration and winter. The Tree Swallow often occurs in huge flocks. It feeds in mixed flocks with other swallow species. The Tree Swallow catches insects in flight and sometimes forages on the ground. It eats mainly flying insects but also may take small crustaceans and spiders. This bird also often eats berries and seeds during cold snaps on wintering grounds or in spring migration. It inhabits open country and woodland edges near water. The male displays for the female with a series of aerial gymnastics.

The nest of the Tree Swallow is of dried stems and grass, lined with down and feathers in a tree cavity, an abandoned nest, a bird box or other manmade structures. It is built by both sexes but the female does more.

The incubation is 13-16 days by the female. The young remain in the nest for 16-24 days. They are fed by both sexes. The Tree Swallow has 1 brood per year.
