

Nature Notes

From the Archive of Raymond O'Connor

American Crow

One of the most widely distributed and recognized birds in North America, the American Crow is entirely black from beak to toe to tail with a glossy violet sheen. Studies of these intelligent birds have shown that they can count, solve puzzles, learn symbols, and retain information. They are often seen chasing and mobbing owls and hawks.

Flocks from a few hundred to as many as two hundred thousand birds may assemble in winter to roost, travel and feed together. Often persecuted, shot, poisoned, and even bombed on the roost in the past, crows still live among us by their intelligence and adaptability and are common throughout their range. They have been widely persecuted in the past by farmers and hunters. They are still legally hunted for sport.

Crows eat insects, many other small invertebrates from millipedes to snails, small amphibians, small reptiles, small mammals, eggs and the young of other birds, waste corn and other grains, fruits, field crops, garbage and carrion. Like mobs of avian predators, gangs of crows gather together to harass a large hawk or owl on a perch or drive it out of the area. They catch up to soaring hawk and repeatedly dive on it from above, often forcing it down into the shelter of trees below. Crows break mollusk shells by dropping them on rocks from above.

The nest of the American Crow is made of twigs and branches, lined with tree material, grass, feathers, moss, leaves, and hair in the fork of a tree or shrub up to 30 m above the ground. It is sometimes on the ground in prairie areas. The nest is built by both sexes, sometimes helped by extra birds.

Incubation is 18 days by both sexes. The young are brooded by the female and remain in the nest for 28-35 days. They typically have one brood per year but can have 2 per year in the south.

Police Dog Tracks Suspect through Wooded Area Near Langruth

On November 8, 2023, at approximately 12:25 pm, Amaranth RCMP received a report of a suspicious vehicle driving in and out of yards on Road 50 West in the RM of Westlake-Gladstone. The side-by-side off-road vehicle had two occupants, and when the vehicle became inoperable, they ran into a nearby wooded area north of Road 50 West and Road 92 North.

Police arrived on the scene and quickly determined the off-road vehicle was stolen from the Sandy Bay First Nation area. With assistance from Manitoba First Nations Police, the area was contained and RCMP Police Dog Services was called to assist. While Police Dog Services was en route, a female exited the wooded area and was taken into custody. The male suspect was still in the trees and was advised through police loud hailer that Police Dog Services was contacted and the dog would be deployed. The male suspect, determined to be Blake Beaulieu, 32, of Winnipeg, remained hidden.

Police Service Dog Jolt arrived on scene and began tracking. Jolt located Beaulieu on the other side of the bush line attempting to conceal himself in a woodpile. Beaulieu again attempted to flee, but was apprehended by Jolt and her handler.

Beaulieu was wanted on warrants for a number of offences, including two assaults and Robbery with
