The official theme for Earth Day 2024 is "Planet versus Plastic". It addresses the environmental issue of plastic pollution.

- 1 in 3 fish caught for human consumption now contain plastic (Marine Pollution Bulletin)
- It's predicted that by 2050 there'll be more plastic than fish in the oceans (Plastic Soup)
- Only 9% of plastic ever produced has been recycled (OECD)
- Around 99% of plastic is made from fossil fuels (Plastic Pollution Coalition)
- 700 species have been affected by plastic pollution (National Geographic)
- Each year, the average American ingests more than 70,000 microplastics in their drinking water. (Earth Day)



Nature Notes

From the Archive of Raymond O'Connor



Least Bittern

This shy bird of the marshes is the smallest heron in North America. Because of the thick vegetation it frequents and its retiring nature, it often goes unnoticed and is probably more common than reported. Its small size and buff inner wing patches seen in flight quickly separate it from all other species.

Adult females have a dark brown crown, back and tail. Juveniles are similar but more heavily streaked.

This bird is a shy secretive denizen of the marsh. It is seldom seen or heard. When approached closely, it often freezes in place with neck stretched upward, bill pointed skyward, and body compressed. It may sway back and forth with the rhythm of surrounding vegetation to help blend into background. When flushed, it flies weakly yet migrates long distances. The Least Bittern lives in solitary or loose colonies.

The nest of the Least Bittern is a platform, bent marsh vegetation with sticks and grass on top. It is well concealed in marsh growth, near or over water, on the ground, or in a low shrub. The nest is built by both sexes.

Incubation is 17-20 days by both sexes. The young remain in the nest for 25 days and are fed by both sexes. They have 1 or 2 broods per year.

The population of the Least Bittern is thought to be declining because of habitat loss, although it is still abundant in parts of North America.

Motor Vehicle Accident on Highway 50

On March 23, 2024, at approximately 9:30 pm, Amaranth RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision on Highway 50 at Road 99 North in the RM of Westlake-Gladstone, Manitoba.

When officers arrived on scene, Emergency Medical Services were providing care to multiple patients. Investigation determined that a southbound car crossed into the northbound lane, striking the oncoming vehicle head on. The driver of the northbound vehicle, a 35-year-old female from Langruth, was pronounced deceased at the

scene. Her passenger, a 36-year-old male from Langruth, was seriously injured and transported to hospital.

The 19-year-old male driver of the southbound car, from The Pas, received life-threatening injuries and was transported to Winnipeg hospital. His two-year-old male passenger was belted into a carseat and sustained minor injuries. He was transported to local hospital and has since been released.


As confirmed by Amaranth RCMP, both the 36-year-old male from Langruth and the 19-year-old male from The Pas have since succumbed to their injuries and have passed away.


