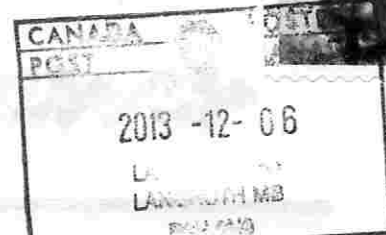

Nature Notes

Slate-collared Junco



In 1973 the American Ornithologists' Union grouped under one heading what were once considered five different Junco species. Thus, the Dark-eyed Junco is composed of geographic races that differ in colour and range but are closely related and have similar habits. All races of the species complex have white outer tail feathers; a black, gray, or brown hood; and white lower breast, belly and under tail coverts. All have similar songs. All but one has a pink bill. Females tend to be paler and sometimes browner on the back. Juveniles have streaked upper parts and under parts.

The Junco lives in solitary or in pairs. It will be found in small family groups after breeding season and in spring and fall may join mixed-species foraging flocks. Juncos form flocks in winter. The Junco forages by gleaning from vegetation and scratching on the ground. It eats hops, seeds, grains, berries and insects. The larger males often winter farther north or at higher elevations than the juveniles and the females.

The nest is built of grass, weeds and leaves on the ground or sometimes in a cavity with a lining of fine grass, hair and feathers. It is typically sheltered by bush, tree roots or logs. Occasionally the nest is in a shrub or tree 0 – 6 metres above the ground. The male gathers the materials and the female builds the nest.

Incubation is 11-13 days by the female. The young are brooded by the female and are fed by both sexes. They leave the nest at 9 – 13 days. One to three broods are produced per year.

The Junco is an uncommon cow bird host. It is vulnerable to habitat loss due to logging.
